Here is a great question that I just received: What does the bible have to say about non-attending church members that have all the rights and privileges of church membership?

Here is my answer:

From a biblical and ecclesiological standpoint—particularly within historic Baptist and congregational polity—the idea of **non-attending members retaining full rights and privileges of church membership** is difficult to justify. Scripture consistently ties *membership* to *active participation, accountability, and submission to spiritual oversight*, not merely to one’s name on a roll.

Biblical Membership: Participation, Accountability, and Presence (1)

Here is a structured biblical analysis.

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Scripture consistently ties membership to active participation, accountability, and submission to spiritual oversight, not merely to one's name on a roll.

Acts 2:42 NKJV

⁴² **And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.**

Here is a **reverse version for clarity**, expressing the truth of Acts 2:42 (NKJV) by stating the opposite to sharpen understanding:

Reverse for Clarity — Acts 2:42

They did **not** drift casually from the teaching of Scripture, but remained **steadfast** in the apostles' doctrine.

They did **not** live in isolation or spiritual independence, but devoted themselves to **fellowship** within the body.

They did **not** neglect the Lord's Table or treat worship as optional, but were committed to the **breaking of bread**.

They did **not** rely on self-sufficiency or prayerlessness, but persevered together in **prayers**.

Clarifying Emphasis:

A church that abandons doctrine, fellowship, the ordinances, or prayer is not merely "less active"—it has reversed the very pattern of New Testament devotion.

1. Church Membership in Scripture Is Relational, Not Nominal**Biblical Truth:**

The New Testament never presents church membership as a passive or symbolic status.

Acts 2:42 NKJV

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Modern-Day Illustrations**1. Marriage Without Presence**

A husband who claims marital rights but never comes home, never speaks, never provides, and never participates is not practicing marriage—he is violating it. Marriage is relational, not contractual. So is church membership.

2. Team Roster vs. Team Participation

An athlete listed on a roster but never attends practice, never plays, and never shows up for games may be legally listed, but functionally irrelevant. The New Testament knows nothing of "**roster-only**" Christians.

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3. Family Name Without Family Life

Having the family surname does not make someone a functioning member of the household if they never sit at the table, never help carry responsibilities, and never engage relationally.
